

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF March 10, 2014

The Village Council met on the above date at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order and present were Richard Clark, Tresa Hundley, Kim Allard, Carl Klingler, Gary Ulm, Randy Hancock, Robert Pflaum, Kelly O'Dell and Paul Summers. Guest was Barry Bright.

Opened with silent prayer and followed by reciting Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion made by Trustee Klingler to approve February 24, 2014, minutes. Seconded by Trustee Ulm. All voting Aye.

Treasurer's Report and Cash in Bank Report for February presented. Treasurer's Report accepted. Turn in projects for new fiscal year budget to Treasurer

Village Attorney Barry Bright was present to give his opinion on West Richland School asking Village to take over the school buildings. Attorney Bright said it is not unusual for the school district to do this. Attorney Bright mentioned examples of other towns taking school buildings, along with the pros and cons, etc. Attorney Bright said the board would need to decide if it would be beneficial to the community. Trustee Ulm didn't think Village should take action until receive something in writing from the school stating what school is offering. No action taken.

Attorney Bright mentioned the conceal carry and what it means for the Village office, park and employees. Restriction signs will be posted at the Village Hall and Village Park. Inquiry was made about cemetery? Attorney Bright will have to check into that. Attorney Bright restriction does not pertain to parking lot and/or surrounding areas and discussed safe harbor prevention. No action taken on matter.

Attorney Bright discussed medical marijuana and a moratorium for Village to implement. Individual would state on application if Village of Noble has an ordinance prohibiting/restricting cultivating/dispensing within the Village limits. A moratorium could state the Village is not taking any types of applications for one year which would give plenty of time to see what regulations will be. No action taken on matter as issue was not on agenda.

Clerk inquired about Village website for mandatory items for publishing. Attorney Bright advised there was nothing that is mandatory to have on website, but suggested putting ordinance from this date forward as well as Resolutions, post salaries.

Village water bills have been estimated for previous 2 months and were read this last month. Village received 10-12 complaints. Mayor Clark mentioned touch read and/or drive by system may want to be considered in future.

Village mowers have been serviced and Dixon mower may need to be replaced next year.

Estimates for the Village truck grille were presented. Motion made by Gary Ulm to accept Josh Stark estimate to replace the truck grille at a cost of \$314.00 (grille for truck driven by Brad). Seconded by Carl Klingler. Roll Call Vote Taken, All voting Aye. Motion carried.

Trustee Hancock discussed streets with Mike Bridges and thought oil did not fully cure suggested placing sand over oil if when temperatures heated up and the oil becomes sticky. Pea gravel was mentioned and if used it would need rolled.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to adopt Resolution to close street for May Day Parade on May 2, 2014. Seconded by Randy Hancock. All voting Aye. Motion carried.

Motion made by Randy Hancock to close N. Noble Ave. for Little League Opening Day on April 26; MayFest (Car Show) on May 3; Chowder on August 9, 2014. Seconded by Carl Klingler. All voting Aye. Motion carried.

Noble Wakefield Fire Department asked for donation towards the purchase of a siren (cost \$1,221.84). Siren would be used for storms only and would be set off by Richland County Dispatch in Olney once visual sighting, personal report and weather service, siren would have remote capability to set off. Motion made by Gary Ulm to donate \$500.00 to the Noble Wakefield Fire Department towards the purchase of the siren. Seconded by Kelly O'Dell. Roll Call Vote Taken, All voting Aye. Motion carried.

Trustee Hancock mentioned alley along N. First Street where people have been parking is getting damaged. Clerk informed board of alley on N. end of town also being rutted up from people driving. No action taken.

Motion made by Randy Hancock to pay bills. Seconded by Carl Klingler. All voting Aye.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to adjourn the meeting at 8:27 p.m. Seconded by Kelly O'Dell. All voting Aye.
