

**OFFICIAL MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF February 27, 2017**

The Village Council met on the above date at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order and present were Richard Clark, Tresa Hundley, Carl Klingler, Gary Ulm, Randy Hancock, Paul Summers, Judith Anderson and Janet Pflaum.

Opened with silent prayer and followed by reciting Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to approve February 13, 2017, minutes. Seconded by Janet Pflaum. All voting Aye.

Village asking for the removal of all ground decorations from the Noble Cemetery by March 31.

The garbage rate will increase by 2% beginning in April - \$9.69 to \$9.88 for the customer's inside Noble Village limits.

Lights have been installed at/along the Park and area of 418 N. Noble Ave.

There were 2 sewer lines entering the septic tank at 446 S. First St. and only 1 was taken care of via connecting to sewer. Nettleton Plumbing is taking care of the second line.

David Wille the owner of 121 W. South Ave. informed Mayor Clark that he had received a certified letter citing a county ordinance (county ordinance only affects unincorporated areas. The Village of Noble is incorporated) from the Richland County Sheriff's Dept. (based on the request of a Richland County Board member) giving him 30 days to clean up the property. Mayor Clark spoke with a deputy and informed him Olney's Code Enforcement Officer does not have jurisdiction in Noble. The Village of Noble has an Intergovernmental agreement with the County to handle nuisance violations.

Thank you to Harold Stallard for helping the Village employees with the repairs on the merry go round in the Noble Park.

Chad Hancock has a traveling ball team (parents and kids) and requested use of the Noble Little League ballfield and wants to paint the bleachers and fence posts and they will provide the paint and labor to do so. Trustee Hancock inquired about a pitching machine and other items in the small shed at the ballfield as to who items belongs to. Trustee Ulm said the building belongs to the Village of Noble and anything inside belongs to the Village. Mayor Clark agreed and said anything left in the building the Village inherited. Trustee Hancock also inquired about Chad using the stuff in the concession stand/building. Board agreed anything in the concession stand could be used.

MayFest will be held May 6

Easter Egg hunt will be held in Noble Park on April 15 and the Car Club will be sponsoring it and providing insurance coverage for the Village. Village insurance company would only allow the Village to be covered if the Village managed/controlled and overseen the event.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to pay bills. Seconded by Gary Ulm. All voting Aye.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to adjourn the meeting at 7:35 p.m. Seconded by Judith Anderson. All voting Aye.
