

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF September 11, 2017

The Village Council met on the above date at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order and present were Richard Clark, Tresa Hundley, Carl Klingler, Gary Ulm, Paul Summers, Janet Pflaum, Judith Anderson and Carol O'Dell. Absent Karen Totten.

Opened with silent prayer and followed by reciting Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion made by Janet Pflaum to approve August 28, 2017, minutes. Seconded by Carol O'Dell. All voting Aye.

Treasurer's Report and cash in bank report for August was provided and accepted as presented.

Fall cleanup in Noble is scheduled for Sept. 13

Noble Lions Cubs will have their Halloween Parade at the Noble Park on Friday October 27; cakewalk 6:30p.m.; parade 7p.m.

The Village office scanner was having issues and Miller's Office Equipment provided the Village with a Canon scanner to use. Miller's traded out the Village HP scanner with the Cannon scanner at no additional cost.

Village received the updated Codebook back, some changes were not made so it was sent back. Once updates done the Village will receive 8 books and 1 CD. Updated Codebook will be on the agenda for the next board meeting for approval (books will be available prior to the meeting for board members to review).

Sidewalks on E. Elm St. & in front of the Village Hall will be formed up tomorrow and concrete will be poured Wednesday or Thursday weather permitting.

Mayor Clark mentioned there is a truck parked on W. North Ave. with a For Sale sign in it belonging to Drew Kessler and thought the truck should be on personal property. Trustee Summers said when traffic is heavy there it could cause a problem. Trustee Pflaum seen an incident where the truck was possibly obstructing the view of traffic coming out of the Noble Post Office area. Trustee Ulm mentioned possibly parking on the South side of the street. Trustee Ulm also mentioned a trailer parked on the street. Consensus of the board to ask owner of the truck to relocate it. Mayor Clark will call.

Clay Miller cut the tree down on E. Elm St. and attempted 3 times to cut out the roots, Wakefield Tree Service attempted 1 time cut out the roots and a backhoe came in and got rid of the roots.

Trustee Ulm mentioned at the last meeting a tree in the park that needed cut down or trimmed. A quote was obtained from Wakefield Tree Service for a tree in the Park and hanging limbs for \$995.00. Motion made by Gary Ulm to proceed with cutting tree down and cutting limbs using Wakefield Tree Service at a cost of \$995.00. Seconded by Judith Anderson. Roll Call Vote Taken, all voting Aye with exception of Paul Summers and Carl Klingler voting No, Motion Carried.

Class pictures from the former High School now West Richland Center was discussed. There are 74 pictures total and the biggest picture is approx. 41½" x 30". Trustee Ulm would like to see the Village have the pictures available for people to look at. Mayor Clark mentioned a clamp system to hold the pictures, attach to the wall at an approximate cost of \$202 and it would require 3 of these. Further investigation will be done and put on agenda for next board meeting.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to schedule trick or treat night in Noble on October 31 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Seconded by Judith Anderson. All voting Aye.

Village employee Bill Manuel painted the bridge across hogrun, sides blue and gold and deck silver.

Trustee Klingler inquired about how much longer Village will be doing mosquito spraying. Mayor Clark said probably to stop after 2 more nights of spraying.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to pay bills. Seconded by Gary Ulm. All voting Aye.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to adjourn the meeting at 7:40 p.m. Seconded by Judith Anderson. All voting Aye.
