

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF June 22, 2020

The Village Council met on the above date at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order and present were Richard Clark, Tresa Hundley, Carl Klingler, Gary Ulm, Paul Summers, Carol O'Dell, Jana Baker and Janet Pflaum. Guest Bill Manuel.

Opened with silent prayer and followed by reciting Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to approve June 8, 2020, minutes. Seconded by Paul Summers. All voting Aye.

Mosquito spraying has begun in the Village.

MFT bid opening is scheduled for July 2 at 10AM at the Village Hall.

Noble Village Hall will be closed Friday, July 3 (observance of 4th of July).

The budget for 2020/2021 will be presented at the next board meeting for approval. Finance Committee meeting scheduled for July 7 at 6p.m. at the Noble Village Hall.

Most Government offices must close for 2020 General Election day (November 3, 2020) declared a state holiday, few exceptions for the government offices: county clerks; board of election commissioners; and government offices authorized to be used as a location to provide election day services or serve as a polling place.

Illinois is going into Phase 4 on June 26.

Motion made by Gary Ulm to continue to waive both utility penalties and online fees to customers for the month on July. Seconded by Paul Summers. Roll Call Vote Taken, All voting Aye. Matter is to be placed back on agenda for the 2nd meeting in July.

Trustee Summers had heard about an individual falling in the Noble Prairie Cemetery and checked out areas (by walking cemetery in random patterns) pertaining to holes and only noticed a slight ditch by the drives. Trustee Summers mentioned a couple of military stones needing attention due to being low and wondered about raising but wasn't sure if possible. Bill Manuel mentioned mole holes by a tree and crawl dad holes, also said he attempted to raise a stone in the past but it was too deep for him to raise. Mayor Clark made recommendation to gather information on stones etc. needing attention and bring back to board. No action taken.

Mowing of railroad property was discussed. Village does mow and charges CSX \$75.00 per hr and is paid with no issues. Trustee Baker inquired about an area/section by Wabash Valley and was told that specific area is not mowed by the Village due to debris of sorts being throughout area. No action taken.

Tom Brandenburg's bill was presented for \$40.00 for weeding all Village flower beds. Mayor Clark recommended a onetime payment of \$80.00 as Mr. Brandenburg had a lot to weed being his first cleanup of all flower beds. Motion made by Carl Klingler to pay Tom Brandenburg \$80.00 onetime for weeding village flower beds. Seconded by Jana Baker. Roll Call Vote Taken, All voting Aye.

Bill Manuel inquired about trees that were to be placed in the Noble Park. Mayor Clark had not heard when they would be placed but said once they are there would be a dedication ceremony.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to pay bills. Seconded by Gary Ulm. All voting Aye.

Motion made by Carl Klingler to adjourn the meeting at 7:25 p.m. Seconded by Paul Summers. All voting Aye.
